Novena to St. Thérèse of Lisieux, Patroness of the Missions

Opening Meditation

St. Thérèse of Lisieux, born in France in 1873, was the youngest of nine children of Saints Louis and Zélie Martin. Her childhood was marked by both suffering and grace: she lost her mother to illness when she was only four, and described herself as a sensitive and difficult child. Yet, through prayer and perseverance, her heart was formed by God's love.

At the age of 15, after boldly appealing to the Pope for permission, Thérèse entered the Carmelite convent of Lisieux. There, she lived a hidden life of prayer and sacrifice, dedicating herself entirely to Christ under the name Sister Thérèse of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face. She never traveled to mission territories, yet she longed to share in their labor by offering her prayers and sufferings for those who carried the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

In her autobiography, *Story of a Soul*, she described her "little way" — doing ordinary things with extraordinary love, trusting completely in God's mercy. It was this spirituality that led the Church to name her both a doctor of the Church and the patroness of the missions.

Thérèse died at only 24 from tuberculosis, with her final words on her lips: "My God, I love you." Before her death, she promised, "I will spend my heaven doing good on earth."

As we pray this novena, we ask for her intercession especially for the people who live in the Pope's missions — in Asia, Africa, Oceania, the Pacific Islands, and Latin America. We join the universal Church in preparing for World Mission Sunday, praying that every person may come to know the banquet of life offered in Christ and the hope that never fails.

We do so with hearts full of joy and hope, under the leadership of our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV — who is the first since St. Peter to have lived much of his priesthood as a missionary. Pope Leo knows personally what it means to bring the Gospel to the peripheries. In this novena, we join him in praying that everyone may hear and receive the invitation to the banquet of life — the Eucharist, the heart of our faith and of our mission.

Take a moment to bring your personal intentions before her. Then let us pray together.
